# With the Heart of Christ...

As we move through a time of transition and change, I am grateful that the love of Christ is and will remain the sure foundation on which everything else is built. And I am grateful for the United Methodist witness, reminding us that our experience of God's love is inseparable from our understanding of God's grace.

Grace reminds us that the love of Christ is not something we earn and it is not something that is given in response to anything we could ever say or do. Before we are anything else, we are loved, we are accepted, we are enough. Each and every one of us. Each and every part of us. God's love puts grace first.

Grace reminds us that the love of Christ is not a passive or vaguely spiritual idea that makes us feel better about ourselves. God's love is what empowers us to respond in ways that turn the expectations of our world upside down. God's love sets our lives and relationships right. God's love teaches us that grace heals.

Grace reminds us that the love of Christ does not strengthen communities in ways that solidify the wall between insider and outsider. When we find our place in the family of God, we are challenged and changed to make room for our neighbors near and far. God's love reveals that grace overflows.

These three convictions - Grace First, Grace Heals, and Grace Overflows - will be the lens this summer through which we begin exploring love "with the heart of Christ."

I don't know exactly what our church will look like 10 or even 50 years from now and I don't know how much might change in the process of clarifying our vision for the future. But my hope above all else is that the ways we love with the heart of Christ will bear radical witness to the overflowing, healing, grace first love that God freely offers to us.

# THE ART OF NAMED WOMEN BY MACI SIMMONS

When you look at certain objects displayed in front of you, such as a flower pot or a tablecloth, can you give it another meaning? Most of the time, we can't. Because to many of us, these items are just normal, everyday objects. But to others, these items can be something more- pieces of art that have stories behind them, waiting to be told.

To celebrate our Nameless. Witness. series, there have been several handmade quilts, afghans, blankets, and scarves on display throughout our church to honor the art of some important, named women. Back in the time the Bible was written, these women were considered unworthy to be given names. Additionally, their work was rarely looked upon and received very little recognition.

Today, more and more women globally are being praised and recognized for their work; the women of our congregation and their friends and family are some of the many examples.

Some of these quilts and blankets were made to keep a family tradition alive. Our Director of Involvement, Phyllis Fernandez, has several quilts that were primarily made by her mother-in-law. She has also kept a baby blanket that was a baby shower gift from her friends. That same blanket has been a family heirloom for many years and now serves as an important keepsake for her grandchildren.

Some of these quilts were created to bond sisters closer together. This was the case for Liza Nelson's grandmother, who made numerous quilts with her sisters, while living on a farm in southern Illinois. One quilt, titled A Summer's Gift, was a wedding gift Liza's grandmother made for her mother and father. Another quilt, titled Drunken's Path, was made as a baby gift for Liza after she was born. Now, Liza has developed her grandmother's love of guilts, as she has bought many quilts from Quilt Auctions, including two titled ABC's Narthex (baby blanket) and Log Cabin. To keep her grandmother's memory alive, Liza and her siblings have kept her quilts in their houses throughout the years.

Sometimes, quilts are just made to bring joy to the people you love and care about. Chrissy Joyner has made and received several crocheted afghans and scarves as parting gifts from friends, and she has given them as Christmas gifts for her family. According to Chrissy, when you give something with a special meaning behind it to someone or vice versa, it is one of the greatest feelings in the world.

When you happen to know someone who has created something with a deep meaning behind it, it suddenly gains a higher significance. That is why we present the art of important named women in our church to recognize their talent and worth.

#### UNITED WOMEN IN FAITH


